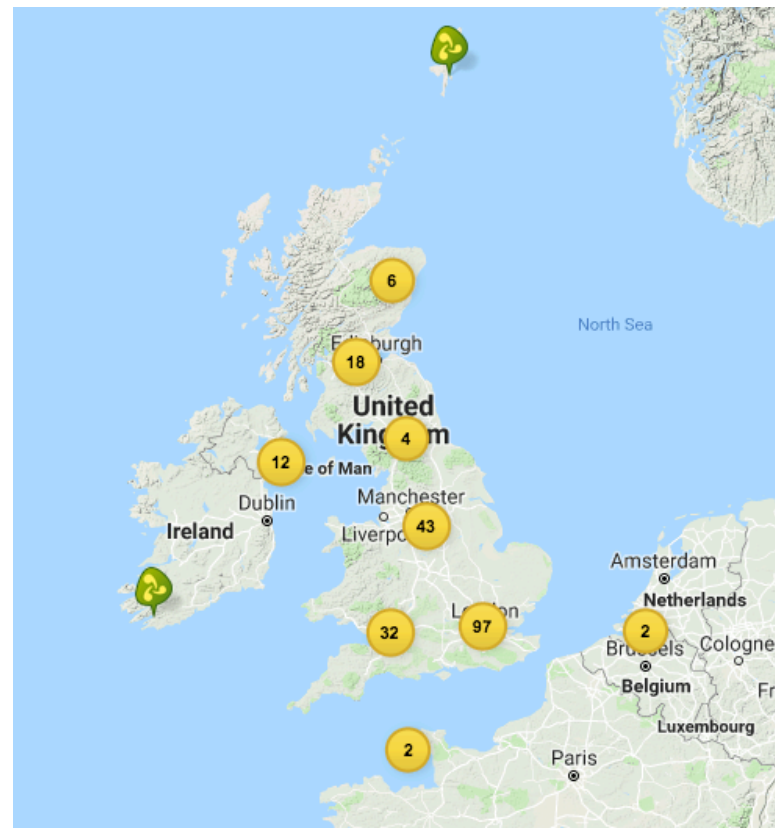
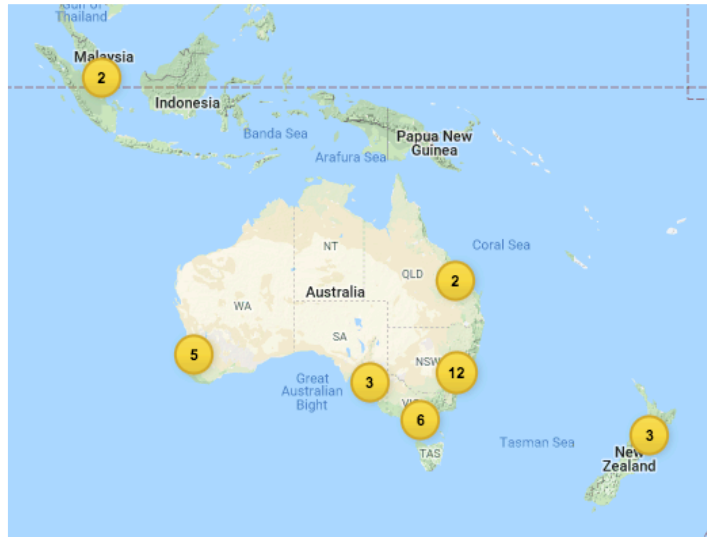

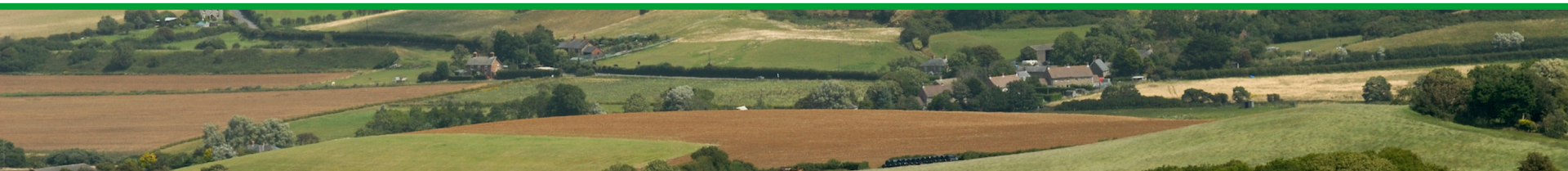

Results Updated 10 Aug 2018

We have today confirmed that, having considered all of the issues raised in last year's consultation on the proposed transformation of Oxford Street, we will proceed with those changes to bus services on Oxford Street which have merit.

The changes are:

Route 10 will be withdrawn, but we will amend Route 23 to run between Westbourne Park and Hammersmith. The amended route 23 will continue to run between Westbourne Park and Marble Arch, but will then follow the existing route 10 from Marble Arch to Hammersmith. We plan to implement

Foreword by the Secretary of State

Reform of the legal requirements for divorce

Overview

The breakdown of a marriage is a difficult time for families. The decision to divorce is often a very painful one. Where children are involved, the effects in particular where there is ongoing conflict, can be profound.

Under current law in England and Wales, couples must either live apart for a substantial period of time before they may divorce, or else they must make allegations about their spouse's conduct. This is sometimes perceived as showing that the other spouse is "at fault".

Both routes can cause further stress and upset for the divorcing couple, to the detriment of outcomes for them and any children. There have been wide calls

Pregnancy, maternity and work in Wales

- Have you had a negative or discriminatory experience* relating to work because of your pregnancy or maternity? What impact did that have on you?
- How does your employer support pregnant employees and those on maternity leave?
- Is there enough support for mothers to enter or return to work?
- The Welsh Government has committed to providing 30 hours of free childcare a week for working parents of 3 and 4 year olds, 48 weeks of the year – will this help mothers enter or return to work?
- What do you think the Welsh Government should do to reduce "the causes of employment, skills and pay inequalities related to gender", particularly in relation to pregnancy and maternity?

Research published by the Equality and Human Rights Commission (EHRC) in 2016 found 71 per cent of mothers in Wales reported negative or discriminatory experiences. Almost half felt becoming pregnant had affected work

We are asking residents and businesses to let us know what they think the council budget should be for 2019/20 by taking part in our budget challenge.

Early in the New Year we will have to set our budget for the 2019/20 financial year but before we do we want your input into what that could look like.

Our strong economy is generating income through business rates and major projects such as York Central and the York Stadium Leisure Complex. These also help bring in money and keep our economy secure for future generations.

However, next year we need to make estimated savings of £4m - £5m, this is a huge challenge given the fact that we have saved £105m in the past decade, all whilst managing the changing needs and demographics of residents across the city and continuing to provide statutory and frontline services.

This has placed us under significant financial pressure, particularly as we try to meet the changing needs of the city. For instance, the cost of adult social care services continues to rise and next year, indeed, we expect it will account for about half of our overall expenditure.

To address this, the adult social care precept was introduced. This money will only be spent by our adult social care services to provide services for vulnerable adults across the city.

At the same time, the financial support we receive from central government (in the form of revenue support grant and business rates income) has been cut from 40 per cent of our net budget in 2010/11 to 20 per cent this year. By 2020 we anticipate even more support cuts and will be
