The Kensington and Chelsea Citizens' Panel


- "A Citizens' Panel is a large, broadly demographically representative group of residents who agree to be regularly consulted on council priorities to assess public preferences and opinions."
- Our Panel was recruited during spring 2021 on a broadly representative basis in terms of sex, age, ethnicity, disability and housing tenure from all 18 of the borough's wards.
 Around 2000 residents signed up.
- The core business of the Panel is quarterly on strategic, cross cutting issues to gather quantitative data on key council priorities. Panel members are entered into a prize draw each time they complete a survey and donations are made to the Mayor's sponsored charity.
- Panel members receive the results of each survey and information on how their views have made a difference through regular newsletters and a dedicated area of the Council's online consultation hub.
- Between surveys, we look for opportunities to more innovatively involve Panel members both online and face to face. This includes workshops, focus groups, using online conversations and budget simulator.




Who is on the Citizens Panel?


Citizens' Panel work to date

- The first survey was launched in April 2021 linked to the Council Plan Update and residents priorities relating to the Council's response to Covid-19.
- The second survey was launched in July 2021 focussing on the priorities in our Green Plan and making the borough greener.
- Additionally, Panel members have been invited to online workshops to discuss the future
 of High Streets in the borough and members living in the north of the borough
 encouraged to join the conversation about the future of the Curve community centre.
- Follow up focus groups being planned on the Green Plan to build on the results from the survey and help develop action plans.
- Panel membership will be reviewed after a year and, where necessary, refreshed to ensure membership is still broadly representative.




Welcome to our Citizens' Panel. We're making it easier for people to get involved in decision-making at the Council in a number of ways, and the Citizens' Panel is one of them.




